Thursday, April 20 - Day 1 – DEPART BOSTON or DENVER – Denver pilgrims will join group in Boston for our direct flight to Tel Aviv on El Al Airlines. Denver pilgrims must pay \$25 per bag on each domestic leg and pick up luggage in Boston and go to El Al check-in. Upon return, Denver pilgrims pick up luggage in Boston and proceed to United Airlines for check-in and same cost applies when checking bags in Boston to return to Denver. No charge for luggage on El Al.

Friday, April 21 - Day 2 – TEL AVIV – Upon our arrival, board our coach and proceed to Caesarea Maritima, Herod the Great's port city on the Mediterranean. From here we will proceed to Mount Carmel. Check in to Stella Maris Haifa, and celebrate Mass either before or after dinner. Dinner and overnight.

Saturday, April 22 - Day 3 – TIBERIAS – We visit Mount Tabor and pray in the Church of the Transfiguration. On to Megiddo and then to Nazareth and the Church of the Annunciation where we celebrate Mass. Drive to Cana, site of Jesus' first miracle and where married couples can renew their wedding vows. Dinner and overnight Casa Nova Tiberias.

Sunday, April 23 - Day 4 – TIBERIAS – We visit Caesarea Philippi, the site where Simon made his profession of faith and was told by Jesus that he would now be called Peter, Rock, and on this rock Jesus would build his church. We will then go to the Mount of Beatitudes to pray in the beautiful gardens and celebrate Mass. From there, we will visit the beautiful church at Tabgha, the site where Jesus multiplied the loaves and fish to feed the multitudes. After lunch, we will visit the church of Peter's primacy on the Sea of Galilee, and the village of Capernaum, to see the remains of the village synagogue and St. Peter's house. We will then visit the ruins at Bethsaida, the hometown of Simon and Andrew, and visit the more recently excavated ruins at Magdala. We will end our afternoon taking a boat ride across the Sea of Galilee. Dinner and overnight at Casa Nova Tiberias.

Monday, April 24 - Day 5 – GALILEE – Today we will leave the region of Galilee and make our way through the Jordan Valley, visiting the Baptismal site near Jericho. From there we will visit the city of Jericho, where we will take the Cable car to Mt of Temptation. After visiting the Monastery on the Mount of Temptation, we will visit Jericho and celebrate Mass at the Church of Jesus the Good Shepherd. We will drive by the Monastery of St George (Wadi Quelt) on our way to Bethlehem, where we will check in to the Casa Nova Bethlehem. Dinner and overnight Bethlehem.

Tuesday, April 25 - Day 6 - BETHLEHEM - Time for shopping at the Three Arches shop (olive wood etc.)– We then visit the Church of the Nativity that commemorates the birth of Christ, including the Latin Church of St. Catherine, the Grotto of the Nativity, and St. Jerome's Grotto, after which we will take a short walk to visit the Milk Grotto. On to visit Shepherd's fields where we will celebrate Mass. Dinner and overnight Bethlehem.

Wednesday, April 26 - Day 7 – JERUSALEM/MOUNT OF OLIVES/MOUNT ZION - Today we visit the Church of the Pater Noster and view the beautiful City of Jerusalem from Mt. of Olives. We then walk down the hill to Dominus Flevit Chapel, where Jesus wept over Jerusalem. We visit the Garden of Gethsemane, and celebrate Mass in the Church of All Nations, and have time for one hour of private prayer in the Garden. Following lunch, we proceed to Mt Zion, stopping at the Upper Room, on to visit the Tomb of David, visit the Church of the Dormition. On to St. Peter in Gallicantu (The Cock Crows), where Jesus was held in the house of the High Priest Caiaphas. We end our day with a visit to Yad Vashem, the holocaust museum in Jerusalem. Dinner and overnight Bethlehem

Thursday, April 27 - Day 8 – JERUSALEM - We begin the day with a visit to the Church of St. Ann (Mary's mother) and the Pool of Bethesda. We also visit Lithostrotos, the Ecce Homo Arch built by the Romans in A.D. 70 and the Convent of the Sisters of Zion. We prayerfully walk the Stations of The Cross along the Via Dolorosa concluding at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher where we celebrate Mass. After free time for shopping and lunch in the Christian Quarter, we tour the Jewish Quarter, making our way to the Western (Wailing) Wall. Dinner and overnight Bethlehem.

Friday, April 28 - Day 9 – DEAD SEA - We celebrate Mass in Bethlehem before leaving for the activities of the day. We drive through the wilderness of Judea to ascend Masada by cable car. This was the mountaintop fortress of King Herod where from 70-73 AD, the Jewish defenders made the last stand of the Jewish revolt against Rome. Continuing on, we tour the excavations at Qumran, the home of the Essenes connected with John the Baptist and the Dead Sea Scrolls. We then travel to the Ein Gedi oasis nature reserve to see some of the trees mentioned in the Bible and also view the caves where David hid from King Saul when Saul sought to kill him. We stop at a Dead Sea beach where those wishing can experience the clear yet salty waters of the Dead Sea, the lowest place on earth. On our way back to Bethlehem we visit Bethany and Lazarus tomb. Dinner and overnight Bethlehem.

Saturday, April 29 - Day 10 – JERUSALEM/EMMAUS/JAFFA/AIRPORT - Visit Ein Karem, where John the Baptist was born and Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth to utter the words of the Magnificat and celebrate Mass. We travel to Abu Gosh where Jesus appeared on the road on the first Easter Sunday, where we visit Qiryat Yearim (Our Lady of the Holy Ark). On our way toward the airport, we stop at the Valley of Elah where the boy David slew the giant Goliath. We enjoy our farewell dinner on our way to the airport.

Sunday, April 30 - Day 11 – TEL AVIV/BOSTON – We depart the Holy Land on our midnight flight back to Boston, arriving home the same day.

TOTAL TOUR PRICE: The tour price is based on airfare, cruise, land rates and rates of exchange in effect May 6, 2016. All rates are subject to change without prior notice. Should the rates go up or down, an adjustment would be made prior to departure. Refunds CANNOT be granted for any accommodations, services or events that are not used nor if you deviate from the tour. If fewer than 25 pilgrims participate a price adjustment may be necessary.

PASSPORT AND VISA REQUIREMENTS: A valid passport is required. At the time of printing, U.S. citizens holding valid passports DO NOT REQUIRE visas or immunization for the country or countries being visited. Passport MUST be valid until **October 30, 2017** or later. Citizens of countries other than U.S. - please contact the consulate of the country or countries being visited to determine visa requirements.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: International flight reservations are being held on El Al Airlines. No stopovers are permitted. Any changes after ticket is issued, carries a mandatory charge of \$200. Once the tickets are issued, they are NON REFUNDABLE. Additional non-recoverable airline penalties of up to \$200 may be assessed for cancellations received within 90 days of departure

DOMESTIC AIRFARE: For those who make domestic air arrangements to the originating city of this tour, your tour host and Unitours strongly recommend the purchase of tickets that can be changed without heavy fees and penalties as international flight schedules are always subject to change.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS: Specially selected hotels based on twin occupancy with private bath. Single Room supplement of \$290 will be charged where requested and available. If you do not have a roommate and Unitours is unable to arrange one, you will be billed for the single room supplement. All singles are subject to availability.

MEALS: Breakfast and Table D' Hote dinners are provided daily except where noted in the itinerary. An extra charge will be made when coffee, tea or other beverages are not included in the menu of the day with the dinner meal.

Reservations made within 60 days of departure must include full payment. Amex, Visa and MasterCard are accepted with signed reservation form. Final payments will be applied to same credit card on final payment due date. Cancellations made from time of reservation to within 61 days prior to departure - -

\$100 processing charge plus any air penalties noted above. In the event of a cancellation from 60 to 8 days of departure - - \$150 processing charge plus up to 50% of the land cost, plus any air penalties noted above. There can be no refund for any services for cancellations received within 7 days of departure. All cancellation and refund claims must be in writing to Unitours, Inc.
