



#### **Spiritual Thought**



It is typical that sophisticated polling is done just before elections. This means that the voter has a good idea who is going to win. This was not the case in the last presidential election. Many people were surprise when the winner was finally announced. One journalist, shortly after the race, was called wondered if the president-elect himself was rather surprised at the results and humbled before the magnitude of the office and responsibility that now rests on his shoulders.

Try to keep this thought in mind when you read the first chapter of Ephesians. The letter is about a very important election. In the opening chapter, we find ourselves in the victor's campaign headquarters just when the race is called. You can imagine the pandemonium and energy inside the room, especially when the polls were against you. You can tell by the description of the hymn. Nine verses. They are a party, a celebration of the election. In fact, all nine verses make up one complete sentence. It is the longest sentence in the New Testament. It may be one of the longest sentences ever written. The excitement overflows without a break or a breath as one continuous thought runs on and on like a river during a storm. There is only one voter, however, in this election: God. The one elected is you. How did He ever choose such a flawed candidate? What are you going to say in your acceptance speech? You are humbled, grateful, and most of all resolved to live up to the high expectations of the office? Listen to what the letter says about you, "You are chosen by God to be holy and blameless in His sight." That sounds like the election of Mary who is chosen to be the mother of God. Please be clear that the New Testament writers wanted us to know that we are also called to the same holiness and sinlessness as Mary. Why? Our role now is to be His sons and daughters.
