

### **Spiritual Thought**

Every year I go to a fly-fishing show. True, you can see newest technology and the latest gizmos and gear, but I go for the knowledge. Every expert will be there and I want to tap their brains. One year I went over to the fly tying table of my friend. When I got there he told me

he had not taken a break all day and asked if I could watch the table while he got something to eat. I said, "Fine." There I am, sitting behind this table, when a couple of guys come over. They start looking at all the things for sale and point at a fly that had a lot of tinsel, in fact it looks like a Christmas tree ornament. They asked what it was. I said, "That is a Goldie." Then I leveled with them, "Look, I am not a professional. The fly tier will be back in a minute. I am new to fly-fishing and not very good. You guys could out fish me any day, but even I can catch a fish with this fly. I don't know what it is—the gold, its flashy appearance or the fact that it wiggles like a fish when you pull it through the water. Whatever, the fish always takes this fly." One of the fishermen asked me if I knew how to tie one up. I said, "Oh, it is a really easy fly to tie. That's the beauty of it. I'll show you." The guy said, "Can you wait a second, I want to get someone." When my friend came back there several people around his table buying his stuff. He asked, "Where did everyone come from?" I said, "I just told them, if I could catch fish with this fly then anyone could. I share this story with you so we can better appreciate Christ's message. If tax-collectors and sinners can be honorary members in the kingdom, so can we. We need to know this because this is the message that draws us to Christ.

Before I entered the seminary, you may not believe it, I had thick hair. It was a barber's nightmare. When I was young, my mother would bring me to the barber shop and tell me, "The barber is not going to be happy to see you today." One day I went to work to cut some floor studs, plywood and sheet rock. After work, I went to the barber shop. The woman barber directed me to the chair and I sat down. She started to comb out my hair and woodchips, plaster dust and whatever else was living in there fell out. I was embarrassed and I said to her "Sorry about my hair, I just got out of work." "No problem," she said, "I will just use my junky scissors." After the cut, we went to the cash register. In those days, a haircut cost five dollars. I took out my wallet and gave her a five dollar bill and a five dollar tip. Every time I went to the barber's, she would say, "It's so nice to see you Mr. Grover. Come take a seat over here."

We can be flawed and still be wanted, appreciated, and valued. That is God's message to us. What draws us to Christ is that sinners and the flawed are welcome in the kingdom. This is what Divine Mercy means and the thought we should have on these last few days of the Year of Mercy.
