

Spiritual Thought

When our Lord carried His cross on the way to Calvary, He wore a sign around His neck. The sign told the reason He was going to be crucified. At that time, everyone who carried a cross had to wear such a sign. When He arrived to be crucified, they removed the sign and affixed it on top of the cross: Jesus, King of the Jews. It was meant to make a mockery of Christ, but to the rest of us

it is a statement that inspires.

One time I went home to visit and spend some time with my parents. When I was leaving, mom told me to put on a sweater because it was a little raw outside. I told her I would be fine. She insisted, "You are going to catch a cold." Sure enough, I caught a cold. That was my cross. If I had a sign around my neck to indicate the reason for the cold it would read: "Big dummy for not listening to mom and wear a sweater on a cold day." Every one of us carries a cross. But what does our sign read? Does our sign inspire?

A young priest was sent to Brazil. He left his home in Italy, his family and pasta every day. When he arrived, he got into a canoe and paddled up the Amazon River. At the first village he came to, He got out of the canoe, baptized some babies, said Mass and anointed the sick. When he was done, he got back into the canoe and paddled to the next village. He did this for forty years. When his body was too weak to work anymore, he was sent back to Italy. When he returned, God said, "Here is a guy who left his family, friends and country to serve me for over forty years. Now he needs my assistance. I will send him someone to help him." I was the person. He had the room next to mine and if he needed anything he rang a bell. I would drop what I was doing and go to him. Sometimes he asked for a newspaper or help to put on a sweater, go for a walk or have a cup of tea. That year I worked hard on my studies to understand what Christ, the Church Fathers, and the Church says about serving God. It was in the room next door that I learned how to apply those studies in my life. His sign read: "I gave it my all for Christ."

When I was a vocation director, a young guy called me from Alaska asking if he could visit our religious order. He spent five days with us. When I took him to the airport, he told me he liked our congregation and wanted to apply. When he finished all the paper work, he gave me a call. The only thing that remained was my interview with him. I asked him if he could return to Boston. He told me that he ran out of vacation time and funds to finance the expensive trip. It looked like I had to go to Alaska. I called my father and said, "Dad, I have to go to Alaska on a business trip." My father, who always dreamed about going to Alaska to fish said, "I'm going with you." We arrived Saturday night. The next day I had my interview, we went to his parish where I got to say Mass. After he said, "I'm going to take you to a nice spot to fish." He said it should be pretty good because the Salmon are starting to run up the river to spawn. When we arrived we could not believe what we saw. There were so many fish you could walk across the river on their backs. Every cast we made we had a fish. The hours passed like minutes. Toward the end of the day, my applicant had to drag us away to another spot. We drove for about ten minutes and he stopped the car. We got out and we were standing in front of a glacier that ran into a lake. Eagles were flying over the water, and snowcapped mountains in the distance. It was one of the most breathtaking scenes I ever saw. It was paradise. My father was so caught in the moment that he turned and said to Sean, "You want to leave all of this to go to Boston? Are you crazy?" I quickly motioned the zip-the-lip with my finger and said, "Dad, quiet, business trip, I'm trying to recruit him; you are not helping me." Sean turned to my father and said, "If God wants me to be a priest, I am going to Boston." I thought to myself, "Wow." At that moment I read his sign: "Whatever I have to do, whatever the cost."

When Christ carried His cross He bore a sign with a very important message to us. I am your King. When we carry a cross we also bear a message. What does your sign read?
