

Spiritual Thought

Pharisee or tax-collector: pick one. Let's see. The tax-collector will not steal, will not kill, he goes to church, and gives to the poor. The tax-collector will steal from his grandmother. The logical choice is the Pharisee, No? Okay. He is can be arrogant but I can take arrogance. When Jesus picks the tax-collector we want to know why. The Pharisee did not give God a

reason why he needed God in his life. The tax-collector did.

When I applied for the doctorate program, I had to take the GRE exam. I went on the computer and typed "How to prepare for the GRE?" A woman popped up and said, "You don't have to ace the exam. All you have to do is get the score you need to be accepted. Find out what score the school requires and use that as your goal." Well, I took the GRE and got accepted, BARELY. But that is my point. I just got the score I needed and nothing more.

If you now ask how to be accepted by God, Abraham will pop up and say, "You do not have to have the perfect life. But you have to need God.

You remember the story of the Prodigal Son...the son takes the father's inheritance and spends it all until he is broke. The question is, what did the son do with the money? Parties. How do we know? Because he had nothing to show. If he bought a house, he could sell it for food; if he bought a field, he could have grown some food. He decides to go back to dad as a slave. It is better than starving. When the father sees him he orders the servants to put sandals on his feet. Why? Slaves do not wear shoes. Next, he puts a ring on the son's finger. Why? To reinstate him into the family. Lastly, the father slaughters the fatted calf. Why? So he can throw a party. Really? A party? Don't you think he had enough parties? Maybe he needs some discipline. Don't get mad at the son, he was happy to be a slave. Why did the father give him so many nice things? The son came back. He came with a reason to need his father.

As you know, I love to fly fish. When I first began I never caught a fish. I got a book on How to Fly Fish for Dummies. Nothing. Next I rented videos. Nothing.
