

Spiritual Thought



One day Elijah was griping about the people at Mount Carmel. He said to them, "You are like a bird hovering between two branches." In other words, make up your mind: land on one

branch or the other: choose God or Baal." The word that Elijah chose to describe the hovering bird was nog (sounds like pasah). What do you think pasah sounds like? That is right. It has the phonetic equivalent to Passover. Many think that Passover means the angel of death passes over the Israelites because of the blood on the doorpost. It really means that the angel of death sees that God is hovering over your house. The angel of death says "I am not going in there." When God hovers over us, He is protecting us. How did the Israelites survive for forty years in the desert? They had no food, water, protection. God hovered over them in a cloud. Clouds are good at hovering.

Now let's go to the Gospel where Jesus says, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood will have eternal life." When you hear Him say, "Eat my flesh and drink my blood," I want you to be thinking about the Passover lamb. It is the reference that God gives us life, by hovering (Passover) over us to protect us and sustain us in life.

Here is the question: "How do we make sure that we are under the protective cloud? How do I know that God is hovering over me? Let say I am standing on one side of the church and I see that God is hovering over the other side. What do I need to do to make sure that I end up on the other side? I have to need God. When the Israelites were in Egypt and God gave them the Passover. When they were in the desert for forty years God watched over them. When they went to the Promised Land where there was plenty of food, they felt they no longer needed God. And they got in a lot of trouble.

A Syropheonician woman came to Jesus because her daughter was possessed. A Syropheonician is someone who is not one of the chosen people of God, yet she still goes to Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Is it right to take the food from the children and throw it to the dogs?" Personally, I would have felt slighted. I would have wanted to say, "I came to you in good faith. I was told you were thoughtful and kind. I guess I was wrong." The woman knew Jesus would heal her daughter, she stayed and reasoned. The woman says, "Oh, there are kids at the table? Then there will be scraps. We all know kids never finish their lima beans. I am starved; I'll take the scraps." Jesus told her, "Your daughter will be freed from the demon because of her great faith."

Here is the faith lesson. We come to church because we need God. We come and feast on the Body and Blood of Christ because this is Passover. When God hovers over us. That is how we get eternal life. And we really need life. We come here because we need God. Make sure you come hungry.
