

I have prepared a place for you so that where I Am you also may be. I have read this verse many times at funerals. It happens to be one of the most consoling passages of scripture when we think of the after-life. I always picture a large water front castle. Something you would find in England but with Caribbean weather of course. These verses can get you thinking, taking the best things the world can offer and putting in one place. But we would be missing the point. I guess what I am trying to say is that if you heard these words in the time of our Lord that is I have prepared a place for you so that where I am you also may be, you would be hearing a marriage proposal. I bet you are a little surprised but this is true. Today our marriage proposals would be considered more direct: will you marry me. For us engagement is a period of time to get to know each other more profoundly. At the day of the wedding the groom moves out of the house. When my brother got married and moved out it was indeed a sad day for my parents. Well not entirely. My mother had less laundry to do they do enjoy the extra room.

In the time of our Lord it was different. The groom never left the house. Instead, the period of engagement was the time needed to build an addition to mom and dad's house. That's right. You don't move out. Once the addition was prepared and dad said it's ready the groom would get his wedding party and a band and you could here the music from afar. All the young girls in the village would wonder whose groom was coming.

This is a wonderful tradition because the family is always together. Imagine at night they would have a nice dinner and dance in the court yard. My brother lives in Minnesota. We did everything together growing up. I only get to see him once a year.

I often think that the best definition of love, that is, not the poetic dreamy in the clouds love but the two feet on the ground definition of love is the desire to be together.

Not long ago I was called into the hospital. There was a wife who was very sick. You could tell that her husband really loved her. He told me with great pride in his voice that they were married for sixty years. I said make sure you write down your secret. He said it is simple. When I went to the grocery store my neighbor asked me what isle is your wife in? She knew my wife was in the store because we were always together. WE always wanted to be with each other.

Our Lord's invitation to heaven comes to us in the form of a marriage proposal. That is, God wants to be with us. That is the kind of love that God has for us. He wishes to be never separated from us.
