



Fr. Damien served in a leper colony on the Kalaupapa Peninsula of Moloka'l island. Hawaii from 1873 until his death from leprosy in 1889.

He wrote of prayer: "It is at the foot of the altar that we find the strength we need in our isolation."

The Founder of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary.

Declared "Venerable" the first step to Sainthood. The Oblates of the Virgin Mary is an international religious community of priests and brothers serving in Italy, France, Austria, Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Nigeria, the United States and the Philippines. The Oblates are involved in retreat and parish missions, spiritual direction, parish work, the mass media, clergy formation, and the foreign missions.

The US Province of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary is dedicated to St. Ignatius of Loyola, and includes communities in Massachusetts, Illinois, Colorado, California and the Philippines.

The OMV US Province House is at St. Clement's in Boston.
