Reflection by Fr. James Doran, OMV

One day a woman named Melissa was walking in a park and came across a man on a bench who was reading the Bible and writing in a notebook. She asked him what he was doing. He said he was making a day of prayer and recollection. He had recently lost his job as a pharmacist because he would not fulfill a prescription for contraceptives on account of his Catholic Faith. She told him that she had read about his predicament in the paper and asked him why he refused to fill it. He began to discuss with her the biblical understanding of love and marriage and the complementarity of men and women.

Melissa was so intrigued by the man's story that she started going to Mass, then RCIA. She entered the Church and even her Catholic mother came back to the Sacraments. Melissa eventually married a Catholic and gave birth to five children plus they adopted one from China a few years ago.

This month marks the 53th anniversary of St. Paul VI's encyclical Humanae Vitae. Paragraph #12: "This particular doctrine, often expounded by the magisterium of the Church, is based on the inseparable connection, established by God, which man on his own initiative may not break, between the unitive significance and the procreative significance which are both inherent to the marriage act. The reason is that the fundamental nature of the marriage act, while uniting husband and wife in the closest intimacy, also renders them capable of generating new life—and this as a result of laws written into the actual nature of man and of woman. And if each of these essential qualities, the unitive and the procreative, is preserved, the use of marriage fully retains its sense of true mutual love and its ordination to the supreme responsibility of parenthood to which man is called. We believe that our contemporaries are particularly capable of seeing that this teaching is in harmony with human reason."

In **#17** Pope St. Paul predicted that use of contraception "could open wide the way for marital infidelity and a general lowering of moral standards. And men could forget the reverence due to a woman, and, disregarding her physical and emotional equilibrium, reduce her to being a mere instrument for the satisfaction of his own desires, no longer considering her as his partner whom he should surround with care and affection."

The Holy Father also expressed concern that some would hand over to public authorities the power to intervene in the most personal and intimate responsibility of husband and wife. He was a prophet rejected, like Jeremiah and Amos, who we have heard from these past Sundays. The 3rd Luminous Mystery: Proclamation of the Kingdom and the Call to Conversion. Repent and believe in the Good News. I cannot receive as much grace as God wants to give me if I cling to sin. The good news is that God will give the grace.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR TRAINING

A faithful love yields enduring happiness

Married love is also faithful and exclusive of all other, and this until death. This is how husband and wife understood it on the day on which, fully aware of what they were doing, they freely vowed themselves to one another in marriage. Though this fidelity of husband and wife sometimes presents difficulties, no one has the right to assert that it is impossible; it is, on the contrary, always honorable and meritorious. The example of countless married couples proves not only that fidelity is in accord with the nature of marriage, but also that it is the source of profound and enduring happiness. (Humanae vitae no. 9)

Reflection

There tends to be a common view in the culture that freedom means doing anything one wants, anytime, with no restraints. Such a view makes it difficult to understand the vowed commitment to lifelong, faithful marriage.

Bl. Pope Paul VI in Humanae vitae reminds the world that the Church offers a different view of freedom, a view that authentic freedom can only be found when it is ordered towards the truth. When we live our lives according to the truth, as with the example of a husband and wife living a life of faithfulness and fidelity to each other in marriage, we experience the "profound and enduring happiness" and authentic freedom our hearts are truly longing for.

How have you experienced the fruits of living faithful love in your life? Are there areas God may be inviting you to grow in trust and faithfulness in your relationship with Him?

The dates also mark the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne (July 26), the parents of the Blessed Mother.
