How eagerly do we seek Jesus?

We all must admit that we are not eager. Sometimes, we do not seek Him. We struggle with disease, bad weather and inflation while Jesus seems far away. Besides, easy solutions are only a mouse click away: medicine here, video games there, cheap goods over there. I suspect that we are more eager for the Amazon delivery van than Jesus. At least, that seems to come through.

But seeking Jesus is good. The people in today's Gospel seek Jesus after the multiplication of the loaves. Surely, they think, he can do more of the same. Jesus knows this. Yes, food, clothing and shelter matter to sustain life. Our Lord instead points to the people's deepest desire for God and eternal life. He fulfills that innermost desire in the Eucharist. Through bread and wine transformed substantially into His Body and Blood, Jesus gives His divine life — His very self — to each one of us.

How eagerly do we seek Jesus? Rather, we should flip that question. How eagerly does Jesus seek us? He seeks each of us more than we seek him. Does Jesus not say at the Last Supper, "I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you" (Lk 22:15 RSV-CE)? Jesus' mission to seek and heal the lost is encapsulated in the Eucharist. This sacrament allows Jesus to be present in every part of the globe to all who lose their way.

Iesus furthermore fulfills the Scriptures: "For what great nation is there that has a god so near to it as the Lord our God is to us, whenever we call upon him?" (Dt 4:7). We Catholics can ask that same question because Jesus draws so near to us in the Eucharist. If we seek him, all we need to do is stop by a Catholic church. He awaits us there in the tabernacle, ready to give His gifts of love, comfort and peace. Here at St. Francis Chapel, we offer the opportunity to deepen that intimacy with Jesus through daily Eucharistic Adoration. Such adoration brings us face to face with Our Lord and Savior. Thus, He also fulfills his promise to his disciples after the Resurrection: "Lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age" (Mt 28:20).

In the book *In Sinu Jesu*, Jesus tells a Benedictine monk of His great desire to be with His people through the Eucharist: "I would draw souls to My open Heart, I would have them experience what it is to abide in the radiance of My Eucharistic Face, I would give Myself in intimate friendship to souls drawn to Me in the Sacrament of My love" (March 30, 2008).

Thus, Jesus desires not a long-distance relationship with us. He seeks us by coming in the appearance of bread and wine. All we need to do is turn to Him in this Blessed Sacrament. I repeat Jesus' invitation to you: Seek Him in the Eucharist. Time with Jesus is never wasted.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR TRAINING
