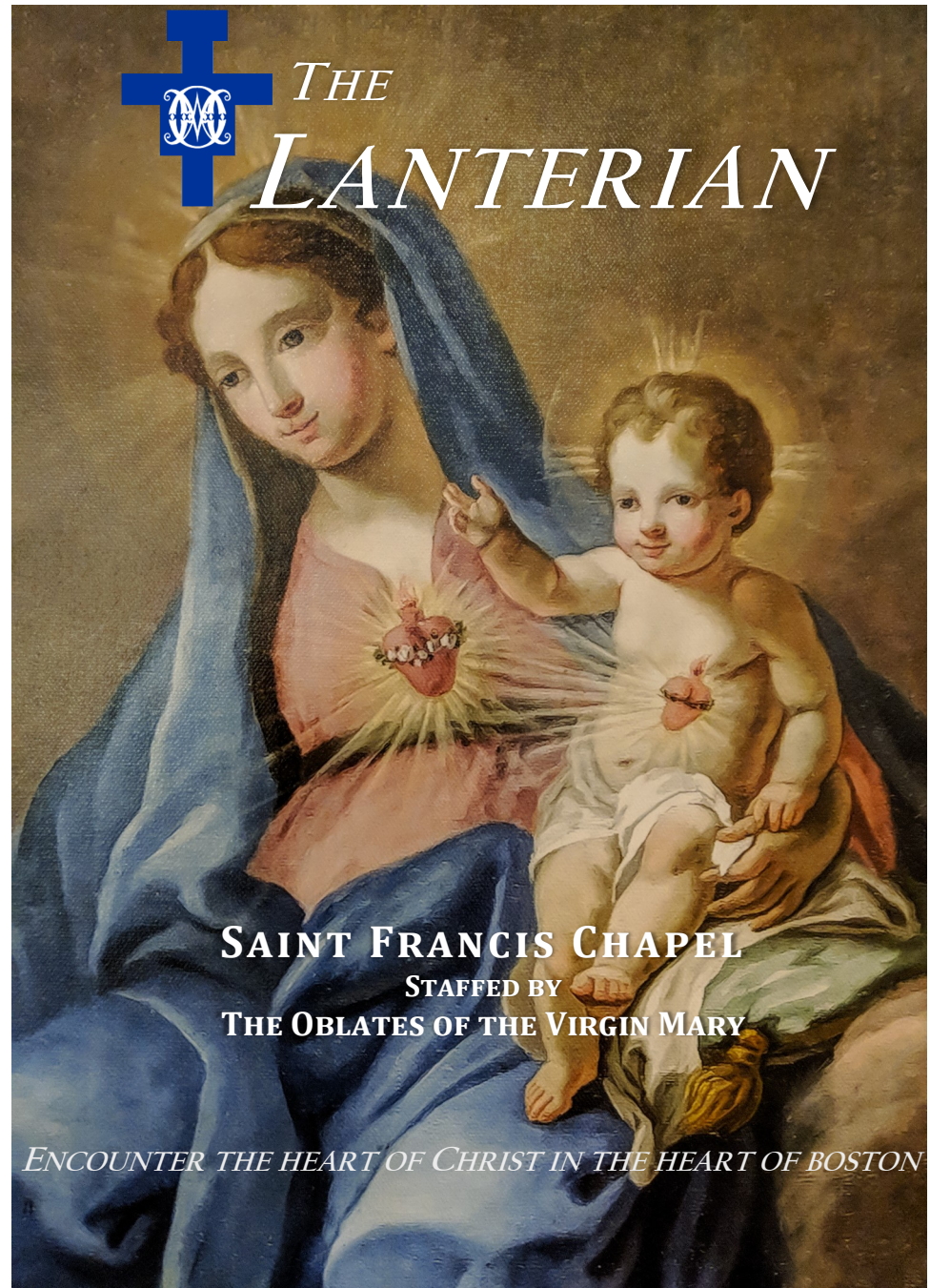

## Reflection

### ***Our Father Who art in Heaven hallowed be Thy Name.***

We do not make His Name holy; we acknowledge Him as holy. We want Him to be acknowledged as holy. In a similar way we acknowledge that **Mary's name is holy**, her person is holy because she is so close to God. September 8<sup>th</sup> we celebrated our Lady's birthday and on September 12<sup>th</sup> we celebrate her name. The feast of the Holy Name of Mary is the titular feast of the Congregation of the Virgin Mary founded by Venerable Pio Bruno Lanteri. Just as the feast of St. Francis is the feast of the Franciscans and St. Dominic's feast is the day of the Dominicans, this is the feast day of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary. Lanteri wrote that Our Lady founded the Congregation, and she has always governed it. Many of us Oblates professed our vows on this day.

Since September 12 falls on a Sunday this year, the Sunday prayers and readings takes precedence. However, there is a votive Mass in the Roman Missal to honor Our Lady's name. The preface reads:

*It is truly right and just,  
our duty and our salvation,  
always and everywhere to give you thanks,  
Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God through Christ our Lord.  
For in no other name is there salvation; at his command every knee must  
bend, in heaven, on earth and under the earth. But by your loving providence  
the name of Mary also should echo and re-echo on the lips of your faithful  
people who turn to her with confidence as their star of hope, call on her  
as their Mother in time of danger, and seek her protection in their hour of need.  
With thankful praise, in company with the Angels, we glorify your power  
as we sing with one voice: Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus.*

In 1683 Pope Innocent XI promoted the feast of the Holy Name of Mary to the universal Church in thanksgiving for saving Europe from the Mohammedan Turks. They had laid siege to Vienna. John Sobieski, King of Poland, leading the Catholic army prevailed. He sent the "**Standard of the Prophet**" to Pope Innocent XI along with these words: *Veni, vidi, Deus vicit* ----"I came, I saw, God conquered!" As the preface reads: *The name of Mary also should echo and re-echo on the lips of your faithful people.*
