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

# Reflection by Bro. Jonas Verdeflor, OMV

What are we willing to give up for heaven? Jesus gives the answer: Whatever jeopardizes our entrance into heaven. He offers the extreme example of sacrificing bodily integrity. Why's that? Heaven has no sin. All the sinful parts in us must be released before entering that love among the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit.

But we must bring this question into prayer: What are we willing to give up for heaven? If we honestly ask that question, we realize that we do not want to give up any bad habits. No. 1 is the excessive need for control. There is a comfort in organizing one's life to create exactly the right results.

For example, I would aggressively schedule my day in the seminary to complete all my assignments. I went to bed, satisfied that I did everything that I had wanted. But that inflexibility provided no time for loving service and presence when interruptions occurred. Schedules must have balance. Some things (Mass, prayer, medical treatments, term papers) must be scheduled to be completed. But flexibility must be included for the unexpected. My ministry at the retreat house has fostered flexibility. Retreats were canceled and added. Leaks in the basement had to be fixed. Sudden trips to the supermarket were made for a necessary ingredient for dinner. A visitor struck up a conversation with me, looking for spiritual help. Afterward, I walked away satisfied that God allowed me to serve Him in that moment.

Furthermore, today's Gospel passage reveals another effect of excessive control: turf wars. Some Christians jealously protect their ministries (serving the poor, providing flowers for the altar). They don't allow others to join nor accept suggestions for improvements. Such a stance is doomed to failure because the dominating personality eventually leaves, nobody can step in and the apostolate dies. But Jesus reminds us that everyone can participate in His mission. "Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give" (Mt 10:8 NAB-RE). We must have our eyes open to reach out and encourage the potential friends and allies in our mission.

How do we give up this unholy desire for control? First, recognize that such a desire comes from a wound of powerlessness. We were once hurt when we were weak. Consequently, we grasp at control so we can no longer be hurt again because of weakness. Next, experience God's loving care. Secure in His hands, we find that the need for power fades away. My favorite prayer is Fr. Don Dolindo Ruotolo's Novena of the Surrender to the Will of God. Facing insurmountable problems, I pray the short prayer: "O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!" God always comes through every time. Once, I was stressed over the multiple assignments. After this prayer, a canceled an appointment and a last-minute extension gave me time to finish. What are we willing to give up for heaven?

Fr. Herbie Alphonso, SJ summarizes it well: "Let go and let God."


# For October, The Month of the Holy Rosary:

**Engage with life-honoring services** by offering women and couples, especially those considering abortion, the information and free services that help them choose life.

**Embrace with life-saving truth** by providing the visual proof of life through ultrasound coupled with a spiritual discussion that we hope leads to a commitment to Christ.

**Empower with life-changing support** by offering parenting classes, material support, help and education they need to be good parents.

# **Medical Services for Pregnancy Confirmation**

Free lab-quality pregnancy testing and ultrasound are offered to women facing an unplanned pregnancy in order to offer them medically accurate information regarding their pregnancy.

### **Mentoring & Support**

We offer individual and group parenting classes that provide the education and encouragement that parents need as they prepare for parenthood or release for adoption.

### **Post-Abortion Help**

Post Abortion Recovery helps individuals overcome the emotional trauma and spiritual issues that many women experience after an abortion. Specially trained advocates lead women through the process of forgiveness and restoration.
