Many years ago, I read an article in the Catholic Digest about a priest who was sunk in despair and total spiritual desolation. He could experience no joy in prayer. He felt that no one was listening as if there was no one who cared. He lay awake one long night feeling the horror of meaninglessness. All of a sudden, there came to him the words, "O Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to *thee.*" He felt warmth and joy. He prayed those words as if she were listening to him and he felt that she was listening. He continued to pray those words throughout the night and in the morning, He got up refreshed. This priest never again experienced that despair.

Immaculate Conception means, **un**like the rest of us, Mary was conceived **without** original sin. The sin of Adam and Eve was passed on to the rest of mankind like a hereditary disease, but when Joaquim and Ann conceived, God preserved their child from the contamination of that original sin thru the merits of Christ's future sacrifice. The Catechism of the Catholic Church: **490** To become the mother of the Savior, Mary "was enriched by God with aifts appropriate to such a role."¹³² The angel Gabriel at the moment of the annunciation salutes her as "full of grace".¹³³ In fact, in order for Mary to be able to accept the announcement of her vocation, it was necessary that she be full of God's grace.

The dogma of the Immaculate Conception states, The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin. By the grace of God Mary remained free of every personal sin her whole life long. One might say, 'Good for Holy Mary! But you and I were not conceived without sin AND we commit many actual sins'.

Thanks to Mary's Son, we have Holy Baptism, the Sacrament of Penance and the other Sacraments that fill us with Grace. And if we persevere, we will live with Our Lord and our Lady forever! We sing a New Song.

Why do we have these holy days of obligation during the week? Three reasons; 1.to recall the **mystery**, 2. to **thank** God for the mystery, and 3. so that it will **bear fruit** in our lives. The fact that we come to celebrate the Immaculate Conception on a day other than Sunday highlights the importance of the mystery. As we celebrate it every year the mystery cannot be forgotten. It is only just that we thank God for the Immaculate Conception. We are all beneficiaries. By the Immaculate Conception we gained a Heavenly Mother and the Savior. We sing a song of thanksgiving.

The fruit of this solemnity is that we grow in Faith by believing that God created Mary full of Grace so that she would be a most fitting mother of the Divine Son. Another fruit is an increase of charity. As we consider and **celebrate** what God has done for us, we **experience** His love for us, and we **love** Him in return. **Hope** is another fruit bearing virtue since we grow in conviction that Mary intercedes for us and that Our Lord purifies us so that we may enjoy eternal life with Him in Heaven.

The Chapel is located in the Prudential Center Mall and counts among its patrons residents and workers from Boston's Back Bay, conventioneers from The Hynes Convention Center and Sheraton Hotel, college students from Berkley, Northeastern, MIT and many other schools in Boston.

Position Summary

St. Francis Chapel seeks a qualified candidate for a stipend position as a musical director. The Chapel celebrates 7 English language Masses on Saturday Vigil and Sundays. The number of Masses led by the director may vary but will also include recruiting and coordinating with other players and cantors. Playing and coordinating for special feast days and solemnities are also expected.

Requirements:

• The ideal candidate holds a Bachelor's degree, or the equivalent, in music or music education with specialized training credentials in liturgical music and understanding of Roman Catholic liturgy, but it is not required; knowledge of performance practice and liturgical styles and forms; understanding of musical, liturgical, and pastoral needs; the ability to exercise discerning judgment in selection of liturgical music based on the parish's musical style; proficiency in keyboard performances, especially piano; ability to sing; knowledge of basic piano maintenance; familiarity with vocal techniques and ability in choral leadership.

• Proficiency with music coordination and training of cantors and choirs

• Applicants who are also trained vocalists able to serve as both piano player and cantor will be given preference, but it is not a requirement Good familiarity with the Catholic liturgy

Job Responsibilities:

• Administers a multifaceted liturgy and music program including planning, scheduling and timely communication with other ministers.

- Develops specific choirs or ensembles and cantors for weekend liturgies.
- Prepares worship aids for liturgical celebrations.
- Selects music for liturgical celebrations in accord with Church documents.
- Oversees compliance with copyright laws and licensing procedures.
- Maintains choir library and liturgical/musical resources as needed.

• Ensures accuracy of information posted on the website concerning Liturgy and Music.

- Helps recruit other musicians.
- Participates in any needed staff meetings.
- Meets regularly with the staff and volunteers and is available to provide any training which may be needed.
