

Reflection

What is your spiritual gift? St. Paul emphasized in the 12th chapter of his first letter to the Corinthians that the Spirit manifests Himself to each member of the Church individually in through charismatic gifts. These charisms serve the whole Church and its unity. The gifts are distributed individually but cannot be used individually. Each of us has a particular gift of the Spirit that comes from the One God and that must be utilized in communion with the One Church and for its building up.

Because we have become accustomed to democracy in political matters it can be tempting to believe that democracy should also exist in religious matters. One letter to the editor in the Catholic newspaper emphasized this point: The Church ought not involve herself in the personal lives of its members because we live in a democracy. Furthermore, who is it that permits the Church to speak for me in matters of morals? This letter writer believed that democratic politics translates easily into every other sphere of life, including the Church.

St. Paul tells us that the Spirit provides gifts “individually to each person as he wishes.” All things in the Church come from God and must return to Him. Democracy exists in the Church in the sense that we each have, not a vote, but a gift, a charism, that allows each person to contribute to the building up of the Body of Christ. The content of our faith and the truth about right and wrong are not ours to determine by vote. Like the charisms of the Spirit, faith and morals are delivered to us by God. Some members of the Church, the pope and bishops, are given the charism of teaching and preserving faith and morals. That is their charism by office. Each of us, though, has a distinct and important role in the mission of the Church to serve one another and to promote the Gospel. Discernment of that individual charism is incumbent upon each of us.

When we celebrate the Eucharist we bring with us to the altar all of the particular ways that we have been living out our charisms in the world. In communion with the perfect sacrifice of Christ, we offer up to God our daily practice of our charisms. As the bread and wine are transformed into the flesh and blood of Christ, so our particular gifts of the Spirit help to transform the world into the Church, which is the family of God.

Position Summary

St. Francis Chapel seeks a qualified candidate for a stipend position as a musical director. The Chapel celebrates 7 English language Masses on Saturday Vigil and Sundays. The number of Masses led by the director may vary but will also include recruiting and coordinating with other players and cantors. Playing and coordinating for special feast days and solemnities are also expected.

Requirements:

- The ideal candidate holds a Bachelor's degree, or the equivalent, in music or music education with specialized training credentials in liturgical music and understanding of Roman Catholic liturgy, but it is not required; knowledge of performance practice and liturgical styles and forms; understanding of musical, liturgical, and pastoral needs; the ability to exercise discerning judgment in selection of liturgical music based on the parish's musical style; proficiency in keyboard performances, especially piano; ability to sing; knowledge of basic piano maintenance; familiarity with vocal techniques and ability in choral leadership.
 - Proficiency with music coordination and training of cantors and choirs
 - Applicants who are also trained vocalists able to serve as both piano player and cantor will be given preference, but it is not a requirement
- Good familiarity with the Catholic liturgy

Job Responsibilities:

- Administers a multifaceted liturgy and music program including planning, scheduling and timely communication with other ministers.
- Develops specific choirs or ensembles and cantors for weekend liturgies.
- Prepares worship aids for liturgical celebrations.
- Selects music for liturgical celebrations in accord with Church documents.
- Oversees compliance with copyright laws and licensing procedures.
- Maintains choir library and liturgical/musical resources as needed.
- Ensures accuracy of information posted on the website concerning Liturgy and Music.
- Helps recruit other musicians.
- Participates in any needed staff meetings.
- Meets regularly with the staff and volunteers and is available to provide any training which may be needed.
