Reflection

The Christmas Octave goes by too fast for me. I don't like to see the Christmas decorations come down and the Baby Jesus put away for almost a year. In the old days it was said that Christmastide lasted till February 2nd, the **Presentation of the Child Jesus in the Temple**. My grandmother kept a beautiful **Infant of Prague** on a shelf year-round with clothing and copes of different colors according to the liturgical season. The crowned Child holds the globe topped with a cross in His left hand and blesses us with His right.

The original statue of the Infant Jesus of Prague was created as a royal wedding gift from a Spanish Princess to her Austrian royal cousin. Eventually it was presented to the Discalced Carmelite community by Princess Polyxenia of Lobkowitz in 1628. When the Saxons invaded the statue was lost. Once found, with the hands broken off, it was kept in a Carmelite church in Prague. In 1637, as Venerable Fr. Cyril of the Mother of God prayed before the Infant he heard these words:

Have mercy on Me and I will have mercy on you. Give Me hands and I will aive you peace. The more you honor Me, the more I will bless you.

Many miracles have occurred through intercession to the Divine Infant. During one invasion, all the children of the city were taken to the Church for protection—praying to the Infant, they were all saved. For almost four centuries, this promise of protection and blessing has inspired devotion and love of the Infant Jesus of Prague.

In the year 1935 the Italian Salesian Father Giovanni del Rizzo was sent to Colombia. He had a great devotion to the Child Jesus. His superior told him to ask people for donations for the construction of a new church in a poor neighborhood in the south of Bogotá. Padre Giovanni was reluctant to ask the poor people for money, so he prayed in front of a statue of Our Lady Help of Christians holding the Christ Child and begged the Baby Jesus to help. The priest saw the Child smiling with arms outstretched as if to say, "Take Me with you". Suddenly he had the courage and inspiration to promote devotion to the Infancy of Jesus. He was convinced that the Father is pleased when the Christ Child is honored.

A very old association had forbidden anyone to use the statue of the Infant of Prague claiming the exclusive right to propagate that image. Fr. Rizzo did not give up promoting devotion to the Divine Child but decided to acquire a new image.

He went to a religious goods store and found an antique statue of the Divine Child a in red tunic, with arms outstretched, against a dark cross behind Him. Fr. Rizzo asked an artist to remove it, as it was too soon for the cross, and to place the words "Yo Reinare" (I will reign), at the base of the statue. To house the newly modified piece, the priest built a small chapel in honor of the Divine Child and preached devotion to the poor, recalling the words, "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brethren, that you do unto Me". Miracles began to be reported. A church was built which proved too small to accommodate the devotees, so a larger shrine was built. To this day it is the destination of pilgrimages.

Our little Lord appears as a happy child with arms outstretched as children do when they want to be picked up. I am reminded of chapter 2 of Sirach, "Cling to Him, forsake Him not; thus will your future be great...Trust God and He will help you; make straight your paths and hope in Him."
