Prayer Exercises for the Fourth Week of Lent

"My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found" (Luke 15:31-32).

Meditation: Many of the great minds of history have sought to determine the central problem that affects human beings. The philosopher Plato said that we have forgotten what we are and need to remember in order to be happy. Freud said we need to satisfy every physical desired pleasure. But Jesus Christ said that our problem is that we are dead and we need to come back to life. He alone is able to do it. The solution to the central human problem then is to be found in Christ, coming to life in Him.

Venerable Bruno Lanteri's Prayer to Our Lady:

O Virgin immaculately conceived, put into my heart those things of your Son most pleasing to him.

For Reflection: Which son do you identify with, the younger or older?

Pope Francis:

The figure of the Father in the parable reveals the heart of God. He is the Merciful Father who, in Jesus, loves us beyond measure, always awaits our conversion every time we make mistakes; he awaits our return when we turn away from him thinking, we can do without him; he is always ready to open his arms no matter what happened. As the father of the Gospel, God also continues to consider us his children, even when we get lost, and comes to us with tenderness when we return to him. He addresses us so kindly when we believe we are right. The errors we commit, even if bad, do not wear out the fidelity of his love. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we can always start out anew: He welcomes us, gives us the dignity of being his children and tells us:

Mothering Sunday:

A tradition that dates back to Medieval England and Ireland in which mother churches are honored. The mother church of every diocese is the Cathedral. A mother church also refers to the church where one was baptized. On Mothering Sunday the faithful would make a pilgrimage to the church of their baptism to honor God for the place of one's entrance into the new life of Christ. If one could not get to the

church of baptism he or she would visit the cathedral, considered the mother of all churches in a diocese.

Refreshment Sunday:

Coming the fourth week of Lent the tradition has been for the faithful to relax their Lenten penances on this day as a refreshment along the way but also in anticipation of the great celebration of the Sunday of all Sundays on Easter.

Rose Sunday:

A long tradition dating back centuries of the pope blessing golden rose ornaments on Laetare Sunday to be distributed as honors on certain of the faithful, on churches or to heads of state. The ornaments are considered great honors the pope bestows on particular occasions. The last Golden Rose to be



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gifted to a person was to the Grand Duchess of Luxembourg in 1956. Today they are given to Marian shrines of cultural significance.

The image to the right is of a Papal Golden Rose given by Pope St. John Paul II to the Monastery of Jasna Gora in Poland, which houses the icon of Our Lady of Czestochowa.
