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Reflection

Saint John Chrysostom in a homily said, "The cross is the hope of Christians, the staff of the lame, the comfort of the poor, the destruction of the proud, the victory over the devils, the guide of youth, the rudder of sailors, the refuge of those who are in danger, the counsellor of the just, the rest of the afflicted, the physician of the sick, the glory of martyrs." Saint Alphonsus Liguori makes an interesting commentary. "The cross, that is Jesus crucified, is – The hope of the faithful, because if we had not Jesus Christ, we should have no hope of salvation. It is the staff of the lame because we are all lame in our present state of corruption. We should have no strength to walk in the way of salvation except that which is communicated to us by the grace of Jesus Christ.

"It is the comfort of the poor, which we all are, for all we have we have from Jesus Christ. It is the destruction of the proud, for the followers of the Crucified cannot be proud, seeing Him dead as the malefactor upon the cross. It is victory over devils, for the very sign of the cross is sufficient to drive then from us. It is the instructor of the young, for admirable is the teaching which they who are beginning to walk in the ways of God learn from the cross. It is the rudder of mariners, and guides us through the storms of this present life. It is the refuge of those in danger, for they who are in peril of perishing through temptations, find a secure harbor by flying to the cross. It is the counsellor of the just, for how many saints learn wisdom from the cross, that is, from the troubles of this life. It is the rest of the afflicted for where can they find greater relief than in contemplating the cross, on which a God suffers for love of them? It is the physician of the sick, for when they embrace it, they are healed of the wounds of the soul. It is the glory of martyrs, for to be made like Jesus Christ, the King of Martyrs, is the greatest glory they can possess."

The everlasting God has in His wisdom foreseen from eternity the cross that He now presents to you as a gift from His inmost heart. This cross He now sends you He has considered with His all-knowing eyes, understood with His Divine mind, tested with His wise justice, warmed with loving arms and weighed with His own hands to see that it be not one inch too large and not one ounce too heavy for you. He has blessed it with His holy Name, anointed it with His consolation, taken one last glance at you and your courage, and then sent it to you from heaven, a special greeting from God to you, an alms of the all-merciful love of God. We adore Thee, O Christ, and we bless Thee, because by thy Holy Cross Thou hast redeemed the world! Amen.

Prayer Exercises for the Fifth Week of Lent

I consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him" (Phil. 3:8-9).

Meditation: Lent is both a season of loss and of hope. It is a time to reassess the things that have held prominence for us and to realize that when seen in the light of Christ they are rubbish. The woman from the Gospel, whose name we are not given, has her public reputation destroyed by those who sought to catch her in the act of adultery. But in finding Christ, she walks away from the encounter considering her reputation as so much rubbish. In finding Jesus she has gained.

Venerable Bruno Lanteri's Prayer to Our Lady:

O Virgin immaculately conceived, put into my heart those things of your Son most pleasing to him.

For Reflection: Is there anything in your life you have lost for Christ and now consider to be rubbish?

Pope Francis:

When we have found the Lord, we must not let this discovery become barren, but rather sacrifice everything else in order to acquire it. It is not a question of disdaining the rest but of subordinating them to Jesus, putting him in first place; grace in first place. The disciple of Christ is not one who has deprived himself of something essential; he is one who has found much more: he has found the complete joy that only the Lord can give. It is the evangelical joy of the sick who have been healed; of the pardoned sinners, of the thief for whom the doors of heaven open. The joy of the Gospel fills the heart and the entire life of those who encounter Jesus. Those who allow themselves to be saved by him are freed from sin, sadness, inner emptiness and isolation. With Jesus Christ, joy is always born and reborn.
