I Am With You.

Today, the Lord continues to strengthen the apostles' faith by his apparition to them. His several appearances after his resurrection brings to mind that He is Emmanuel (God with Us). The timing of his self-revelation indicates in a vivid way that he permits only what we can handle. The apostles were in a moment of uncertainty and fear. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." At this point, the issue of fishing was a sign of boredom and a return to their former way of life. Things became worse after taking the risk of going fishing and catching nothing after fishing all night long. Their sorrows increased, and their frustration heightened. The degree of the desolation that came upon them was so overwhelming. But the Risen Lord showed up at that distressing time and turned their sorrows into joy. He not only helped with a huge catch of fish but prepared breakfast for them. The Lord's presence electrified their mood that was dampened by futile labor. What a great moment to manifest Himself! His presence amid our human precariousness is always providential.


And of paramount importance is our willingness to trust and obey the instructions of the Lord (A Son of a carpenter told experienced fishermen where to get fish, and they obeyed; filling the empty jars with water at the wedding at Cana; Washing in the Jordan River by Namaan, the Syrian General).

His Presence is an opportunity. This appearance of Jesus to his apostles afforded Peter the opportunity to undo the effects of his tripple denial of his master by his three times affirmation of his readiness to accept the responsibility of governing the Church. Brant Pitre put it thus: "As Jesus says, 'Do you love me more than these?' So, the three questions (do you love me?) correspond to the three denials by Peter, and then the three exhortations establish Peter as the shepherd of the Church, as the shepherd of the disciples, as the shepherd of Jesus' one flock."

Similarly, his appearance was also an occasion to learn about the possible and inevitable trials that go with caring for the flock. Peter, the Chief Shepherd, got firsthand information about how he will die. It was not surprising therefore that they were not intimidated by the authorities when asked not to speak about the Name of Jesus. Vima Dasan says: "Trials will when we try to feed the lambs not just with the bread of the Eucharist, but with... food and drink, Trials will come when we are called to join the parish faith-sharing group, Justice and Peace group and similar action groups to build the Kingdom of God. Trials will come when we are urged to smile the risen power of Christ into our secular society, bringing Christian values to play in business, education and families."

The Risen Lord is never tired of revealing himself to us. His constant selfdisclosure in our human affairs is always reassuring and faith-awakening in moments of uncertainty. Therefore, let us always be open to his presence and readily carry out his instructions.

The Leader stands before the image of the Mother of God and alternates saying the prayer of thanksgiving and invocation with the others

Leader: Lord, we bless you, for you are full of mercy and justice: you humble the proud and exalt the lowly. **All Respond:** You gave us the highest example of your divine wisdom in the

mystery of the Word made flesh and of his virgin Mother.

Leader: Your Son, humbled by death, rose glorious at your right hand, the King of all creation.

All Respond: The Virgin, who acknowledged herself to be a servant, became the Mother of our Redeemer and of those reborn in her Son. Now, raised above the angels, she prays for all: the Queen of mercy and grace.

Leader: Bless us as we crown this image of the Mother of your Son.

All Respond: We confess Christ to be the King of creation and call upon Mary, our Queen. May we walk in their likeness, spending ourselves for the sake of others. Content with our place in this life, may we one day hear your voice inviting us to take our place in heaven and receive the crown of victory.

The Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary is then prayed.

After the litany, the Leader says: Gracious Lord, with love and devotion we have honored the holy Mother of God. May she continue to intercede for us with Jesus Christ, her Son, now and for ever.

All respond: Amen.
