Reflection by Fr. James Doran, OMV

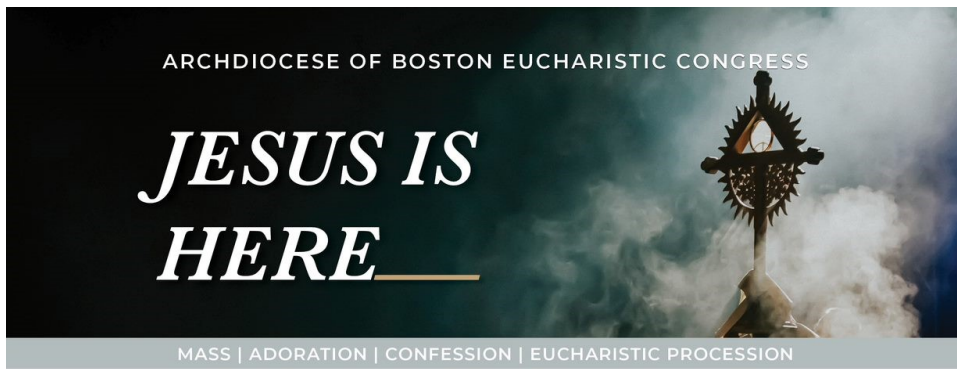
Saint Anthony of Padua was born into a noble family in Lisbon, Portugal in about 1195 and was baptized with the name of Fernando. He entered the Canons of St Augustine and dedicated himself to the study of the Bible and of the Church Fathers. Then something happened in Coimbra that changed his life. The relics of the first five Franciscan missionaries who had been sent to Morocco, were brought to Coimbra. But these relics were not small, as we know relics. These relics were headless mutilated bodies. Their story inspired in young Fernando the desire to imitate them, so he asked to leave the Augustinian Canons to become a Franciscan Friar Minor. His request was granted and having taken the name of Anthony, he set out for Morocco, but God had another plan. After an illness he had to return to Italy and, in 1221, participated in a huge meeting of the Order in Assisi, where he met St. Francis. His superiors discovered that he was an excellent preacher, so they sent him on a mission. He embarked on apostolic work in Italy and France that was so intense and effective that many people who had left the Church came back. Maybe that is why he is Patron of helping us find what is lost, making him the busiest saint in Heaven!

Bonillo was a heretic in France who denied the Real Presence of Our Lord in the Eucharist. St. Anthony proposed a test. *"If, after Bonillo withheld food from his donkey for three days, the donkey would kneel in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, rather than first partake of the hay that would be offered him, Bonillo would agree to believe in the Real Presence. Bonillo brought the fasting donkey, and behold, the donkey knelt before the Blessed Sacrament carried by St. Anthony rather than eat the hay presented to it. (THE 33 DOCTORS OF THE CHURCH BY Fr. At the beginning of the 13th century, cities were growing, and trade was flourishing. Some people were becoming wealthy and the number of people who were **insensitive** to the needs of the poor increased. Anthony invited the faithful to think of the **true** riches, those of the **heart**, which make people good and merciful and help them to lay up treasure in Heaven. *"O rich people"*, he urged them, *"befriend... the poor, welcome them into your homes: it will subsequently be they who receive you in the eternal tabernacles in which is the beauty of peace, the confidence of security and the opulent tranquility of eternal satiety"*.

We do have a collection box at the entrance named 'St. Anthony's Bread'. The contents go to assist the poor. St. Anthony, pray for us.

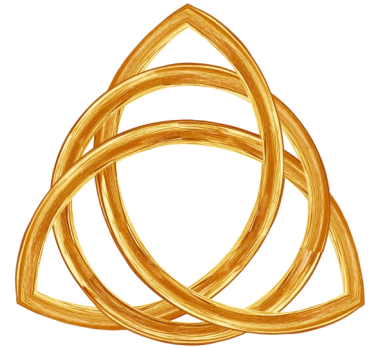

Trinity Sunday

Christians are baptized “in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit” Before receiving the sacrament, they respond to a three-part question when asked to confess the Father, the Son and the Spirit: “I do.” “The faith of all Christians rests on the Trinity.



Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit: not in their names, for there is only one God, the almighty Father, his only Son and the Holy Spirit: the Most Holy Trinity.

The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the “hierarchy of the truths of faith”. The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men “and reconciles and unites with himself those who turn away from sin” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 232-234).

Prayer to the Holy Trinity

The Father is my hope. The Son is my refuge. The Holy Spirit is my protector. Glory to the holy and undivided Trinity, now and for ever. Let us praise the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit; let us bless and exalt God above all for ever! Almighty and everlasting God, to whom we owe the grace of professing the true faith, grant that while acknowledging the glory of the eternal Trinity and adoring its unity, we may through your majestic power be confirmed in this faith and defended against all adversities; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
