



The Fire of Baptism

St. Catherine of Siena said: "Be who God meant you to be, and you will set the world on fire. The Lord Iesus declared: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing." He was preoccupied with the urgency of the blazing of the purifying fire of love. It is an irresistible fire that effects the necessary change that brings freedom to humanity. It was the fire that burned in the heart of the Prophet Ieremiah that he could not resist speaking the truth in the interest of the welfare of many in the time of King

Zedekiah, With the threat of Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon. It is the fire that rouses the missionary courage a disciple needs, a fire that sustained the sacrifice of Calvary.

The Image of Baptism was also employed to drive home the prophetic/redemptive mission. "There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished." Christ longed to be immersed into the baptism of his inevitable suffering that will terminate in his death at Calvary for the salvation of humanity.

In the light of the gain inherent in the flame brought by Christ with the baptism of trials that brought freedom to mankind, everyone is invited to be opened to the purifying flame of love and to be immersed into this baptism. In order to respond properly to this invitation, a firm commitment and total reliance on the Lord is needed.
