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

# Reflection by Fr. James Doran, OMV

Korea received the faith not through foreign missionary priests but through laymen. A couple of times year an embassy was sent from Korea to China. In 1773 during one of these trips, scholars acquired books on Christianity and became convinced of the truth of the faith. They taught the faith to their countrymen but without a priest, they could only baptize. In 1784 a Chinese Catholic priest was smuggled into the country. The government opposed Catholicism because they saw it as conflicting with Confucianism.

During the 1800's more than ten thousand Korean Catholics and their missionaries were martyred. One-hundred and three were canonized by Pope St. John Paul in 1984. The Church commemorates these martyrs on September 20 under the names of Saints Andrew Kim Tae-gon, priest and Paul Chong Ha-sang, and Companions, Martyrs. St. Andrew Kim Taegon was ordained secretly in China. He was the first Korean priest in the Church's 60-year history in Korea. He tried to introduce French missionaries from China into Korea, enlisting the aid of Chinese fishermen. For this, Father Kim Tae-gon was arrested and sent to the central prison in Seoul, where was charged as the ringleader of a heretical sect and traitor to his country. He was sentenced to death and was beheaded on 16 September 1846.

St. Paul Chong was a seminarian, about to be ordained when a persecution broke out. Paul was captured and gave the judge a written statement defending Catholicism. The judge, after reading it, said, "You are right in what you have written; but the king forbids this religion, it is your duty to renounce it." Paul replied, "I have told you that I am a Christian and will be one until my death." After this Paul went through a series of tortures in which he apparently remained tranquil. Finally, he was bound to a cross on a cart. Paul and his family were beheaded outside Seoul on September 22, 1839.

Jesus says we do not light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house. Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father. Mt 5:15-16 These are the lamps that we do not hide under a basket. The Church raises the saints to the altars so that everyone can see the light of Christ in these faithful martyrs. 6


# Among the Korean Martyrs, Family of Saints

Jeong Yak-jong, Cecilia Yu were converts to Catholicism by the first priest to enter into Korea, a Chinese priest in the last years of the 18th century. They quickly became fervent disciples of Christ, helping to organize the Church in Korea and spread the Gospel. They had three children who were also fervent in the Faith. Jeong and his eldest son Charles Chong were martyred by Korean authorities in 1801. After her husbands death Cecilia had most of her possessions taken from her by state authorities, and she was subject to harassment. She was interrogated and tortured twelve times

The second son, Paul, became a great evangelizer and promoter of the Church in Korea after the last Korean priest had been martyred. He labored in the first half of the 19th century to keep the Faith alive in Korea with catechisms, prayer meetings and by leading a network of lay Catholics hosting and protecting Chinese priests who entered the country. In 1839 the Korean authorities arrested and executed Paul as an enemy of the state. Cecilia died in prison two months later and the youngest sister, Jung, died three months after that.

This was truly a saintly family that labored, suffered and ultimately died to keep Jesus Christ in the hearts and minds of their beloved countrymen and in their beautiful homeland of Korea,

O God, who have been pleased to increase your adopted children in all the world, and who made the blood of the Martyrs Saint Andrew Kim Tae-gon and his companions a most fruitful seed of Christians, grant that we may be defended by their help and profit always from their example. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
