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

Reflection by Fr. Michael Warren, OMV

By baptism the faithful become children of God, heirs to the Kingdom and temples of the Holy Spirit. The moral life we live is not one that is to be lived in crippling fear of God's punishment, nor as if earning a reward from a benefactor. We live a life of charity as children loving their Father, who loves them into being.

Our moral life is a response of love to the One who first loved us. The children of God do good for its own sake, not for reward, not to avoid punishment. This life of charity in the Spirit generates joy and peace, and fruitfully blossoms in mercy. The goal of the moral living is love and friendship; it is communion. Real love, not simple romantics, but deliberately choosing the good of the other person, and participating in that other person's good is the epitome of love.

The greatest love is for God as He is the most excellent and deserving of all love. To love God first and with all one's being is the most important perfection of any person. We are made in the image of God and to fully image Him is to do as he does, which is to love. The Love that God the Father and God the Son have for each other is the Holy Spirit. This life of Love is gifted to us in Baptism and strengthened in all the sacraments. When that love is fully active within us we are empowered to live under the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. These gifts are real and are in us by Baptism and Confirmation. They elevate and perfect our natural human virtues. For Example, whereas natural courage is needed to face the difficulties of life, the Gift of Fortitude elevates courage beyond the natural and gives us a divine strength to stand firm against powers that threaten our life of holiness. All the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit make us docile to divine inspiration and empower us to truly live by the Spirit instead of the flesh.

We prepare for these gifts to be active within us through the practice of the natural virtues, through prayer and the sacraments. The efforts required of us to practice virtue, develop a prayer life and celebrate the sacraments is the most important part of emulating what St. Peter reminds us in the second reading, put to death what is strictly of the worldly flesh so that we might be more open to the life of the Spirit.
