Lost in Contemplation

The Feast of the Transfiguration of Christ recalls the unveiling of the Divinity of Jesus Christ, the beloved son of the Father. Contemplating this important event in the life of Christ makes one marvel, considering the fact that everything about it is mind blowing. The Place, A Mountain top. It is usually a place for encounter, where personalities in the Old Testament went for the purpose of encountering God. In a unique manner, the Lord decided that this event should occur on a mountain top. In our individual encounter with the Lord, we should always go to our respective Mountain tops: quiet, less distracting corners in our rooms, in the Church, and other places of encounter.

The Personalities: There were different personalities involved, personalities from above (Moses and Elijah) and from below (Peter, James, and John) with Christ between them. First, these personalities attested to and fulfilled the scripture that requires two or three witnesses to sustain a charge (Deut. 17: 6). To assure and prove beyond every reasonable doubt, the Lord gave two Old Testament witnesses and three New Testament witnesses. Secondly, Old Testament witnesses, Moses and Elijah, represent the Law and the Prophets. Going by the popular belief among the Jews that the Law represents the "Will of God" while the Prophets represent the "mind of God" in the sense that they expressed God's mind, i.e., the will and the mind of the Father, made known once more by God the Son, standing between the Law and Prophets. And God the Father, in the presence of God the Holy Spirit represented by the Cloud, declared, "this is my beloved Son listen to Him." By all standards, we cannot be lost enough in the contemplation of the transfiguration of Christ. The Trinitarian manifestation is by all means a call to a responsible adhesion to a life in the Trinity by living out our Christian vocations, this clarion call from the Father to listen and act accordingly draws our attention to always be active and intentional followers of Christ. Just as Peter, James and John were witnesses to the manifestation Jesus' Divine Nature, so too, we will be his witnesses to everyone.

May his sufficient grace enable us to listen and act well and be moved from contemplation to Right Action.


