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Reflection by Venerable Bruno Lanteri


Jesus still speaks every day in his Gospel; but he speaks admirably in the intimate secrets of the heart: for he is the very word of the Eternal Father, where all truth is enclosed. It is therefore necessary to lend him our inner ears of which it is written: "The Lord opened my ear (Isaiah 50:5)."

Happy is he whose ears God has opened in this way; he has only to always prayer attentively. Jesus will speak to him soon, and all he has to do is listen to his voice. Mary of Bethany was sitting at the feet of Jesus. Sit quietly at the feet of Jesus with humility and submission; submit to the eternal word, the truth, be silent. Let God alone speak at this time. At least half an hour: this great silence of the soul, in which everything ceases, where everything is silent before God, in heaven, in the upper part of your soul, which is rare during this life. Be attentive, Christian soul, do not let yourself be distracted from these blessed moments.

Enter the closet of your heart and shut the door; pray to your Father in secret, and your Father who sees you in secret will reward you. What will he give you? Word for word: the word by which you have asked him to instruct you, for the word by which he will make you hear what he wants from you, with his eternal truth.

Come in, and close the door: enter into yourself, and do not be distracted by anything. When you would be a Martha, a holy soul who would come to invite you to serve Jesus, remain locked in these holy and blessed moments. Jesus does not want you for these external services: all the service he wants from you is that you listen to him alone, and that you lend the ear of the heart to his word.

Speak then, Lord, it is time: your servant listens. Speak and what will you say? "Martha, Martha, you are eager, and you trouble yourself in the care of many things. But there is only one thing that is necessary." Must we not fulfill all his duties, all his commands? It must be done without doubt, but you must never be over-eager, for there are happy moments when every other duty, every other exercise, every other obedience yields to prayer: there is no other obedience for you than that of listening to Jesus, who desires that you listen.
