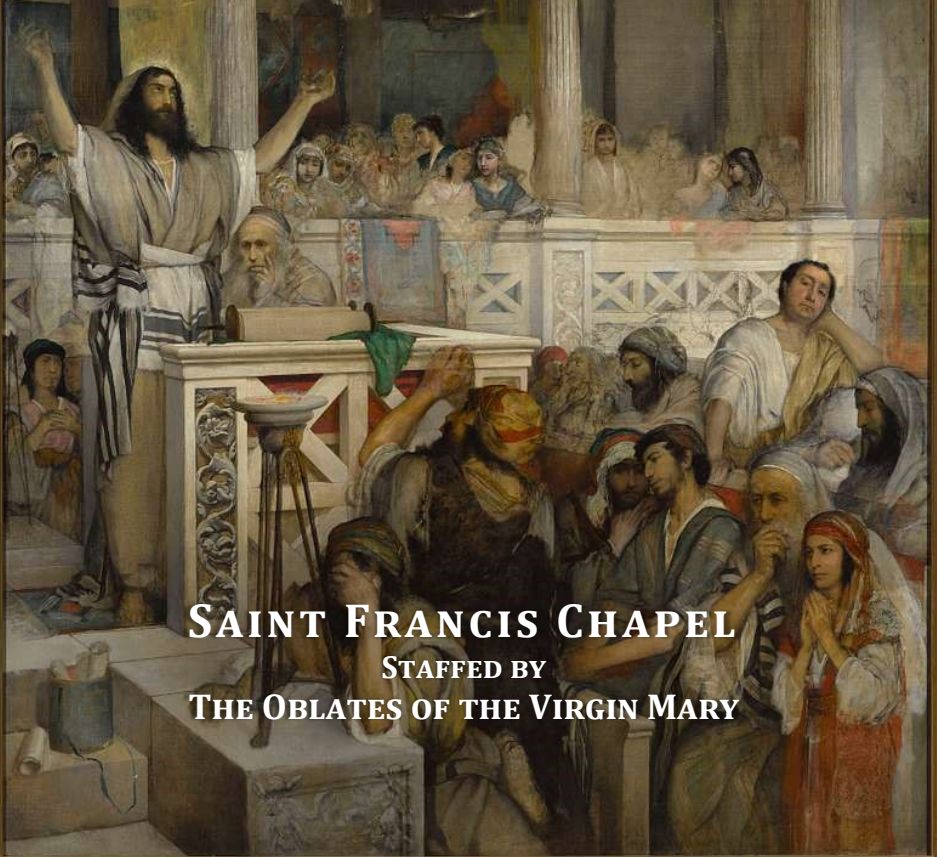

Behold, O my soul, the demonstration of Jesus Christ's love for you. He is not content to teach you by doctrine and example to suffer, but He suffers for you. Behold your Jesus Christ there in the garden, covered with blood sweat and agonizing, full of sadness. "My soul is saddened, even unto death."

Is the Passion that He is about to suffer, the cause perhaps of such agony? Yes, but not the only one. Your sins are the greater cause of it than the pangs of Jesus Christ. Seeing the malice of so many of your sins, which you would have committed even after His suffering, was what saddened Him, made Him pray to the eternal Father to turn away the bitter cup from Him, and made Him sweat copious blood. And what do you do at such a sight? O my heart harder than boulders, thou full of iniquity, the cause that the heart of Jesus Christ is full of bitterness, wilt thou not be moved, and Jesus Christ alone shall have for thee to spasm? Oh hardness! Oh callousness! How long will you wait to understand what a great evil sin is, and what your contrition should be for those committed, if you do not understand it, and do it now together with Jesus Christ. *O my Jesus Christ, why is it that all suffering is innocent for you, but not even pitying You is guilty for me? Give me, I beseech Thee, a drop of that blood, and I will change this heart into another.*

Prayer of Venerable Bruno

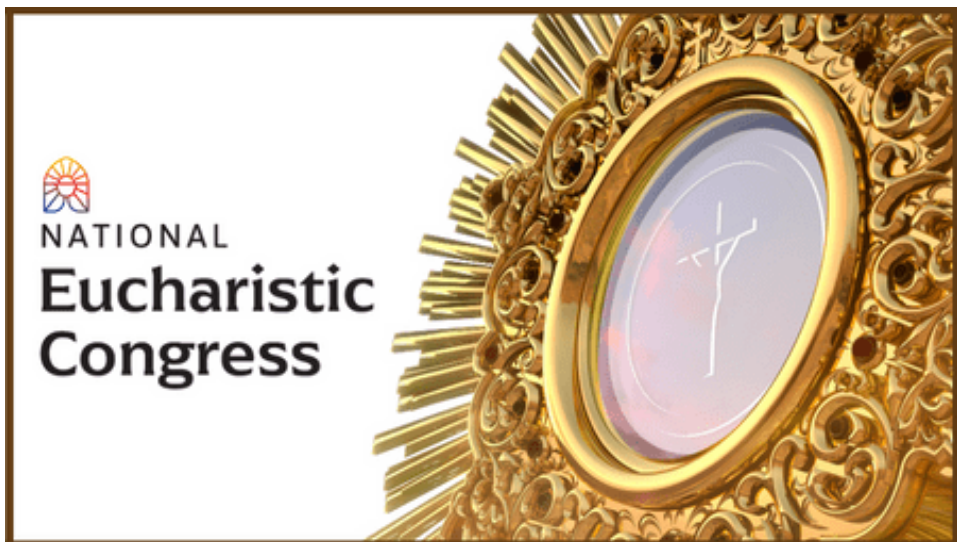
O my God, you gave me this heart so that already it is yours, and now you ask me for it, and offer me yours in return, and go so far as to beg it from me; and this for my sake alone.

Welcome to the Chapel! St. Francis Chapel here in the Prudential Center has a long and blessed history. Our doors first opened to the faithful in November 1969 and Franciscans were the first to minister here. The Oblates of the Virgin Mary (OMV) began to administrate and serve here in 1983 at the invitation of Cardinal Humberto Medeiros. With our OMV Seminary and Provincial Headquarters nearby at St Clement Eucharistic Shrine on Boylston St., and with our St Joseph Retreat House in Milton, MA, our priests, brothers and seminarians have been able to joyfully serve people from Boston and just about every country in the world for more than 50 years here at the Chapel.

The Chapel is a sacred place. We offer three daily Masses, daily Eucharistic Adoration, six hours of daily Confession availability, and Nine Sunday Masses in English and Spanish. Many people drop in to pray and light a candle for their intentions and to venerate the Relics of St John Paul II, St Faustina and St Maximilian Kolbe. We are proud of our well-stocked Giftshop/Bookstore. The OMV Priests who serve here are delighted to be servants of God's Mercy in a particular way in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
