

Since May 17, over 100,000 pilgrims have walked with Jesus along four different routes toward the last 5 days of Eucharistic revival in Indiana (Eucharisticcongress.org). The hope for participants in the pilgrimage and congress is their experiencing a "profound, personal renewal through the power of Christ's love. Like a new Pentecost, transformation will flow out from Indianapolis to bring revival in out communities as the Church returns to her first love-the source and summit of our faith."



La Sagrada Eucaristía

Hoy, 21 de julio, es el último día del X Congreso Eucarístico Nacional, en Indianápolis. Desde el 17 de mayo, más de 100.000 peregrinos han caminado con Jesús a lo largo de cuatro rutas diferentes hacia los últimos cinco días de avivamiento eucarístico en Indiana (Eucharisticcongress.org). My God, I offer you this holy sacrifice to proclaim, honor and glorify your infinite greatness, and in recognition of the supreme dominion which, as the first principle and last end, you have above all created things. I give you this homage for all those who still do not know you or do not want to recognize you.

I offer this too in thanksgiving for the benefits that I and all the world have received and will receive from your infinite goodness; in satisfaction for my sins and those of the whole world; to implore the graces that are necessary for my eternal salvation and for all mankind. Oh, my God, I offer to you the merits of Jesus Christ; grant me at this Holy Mass a profound adoration of him.

My God, my Creator, I implore you to grant me the grace of final perseverance. I know by faith that I do not deserve it, nor can I deserve it, but your Divine Son deserves it for me with all his virtues and with all the wounds he shows you in his Most Holy Body, on behalf of my wounded love. Amen.

The Didache—The Lord's Teaching through the Twelve Apostles to all the Nations

The Teaching of the Twelve Apostles is a documents circulated in the early Church in the first century A.D. It is the oldest surviving catechism of the Church. Chapters 9, 10 and 14 discuss the celebration of the Eucharist and prayers that should be used by the priest and the people.

Chapter 9

But as touching the eucharistic thanksgiving give ye thanks thus.

First, as regards the cup:

We give Thee thanks, O our Father, for the holy vine of Thy son David, which Thou madest known unto us through Thy Son Jesus;

Thine is the glory for ever and ever.

Then as regards the broken bread:

We give Thee thanks, O our Father, for the life and knowledge which Thou didst make known unto us through Thy Son Jesus;

Thine is the glory for ever and ever.

As this broken bread was scattered upon the mountains and being gathered together became one, so may Thy Church be gathered together from the ends of the earth into Thy kingdom;

or Thine is the glory and the power through Jesus Christ for ever and ever.

But let no one eat or drink of this eucharistic thanksgiving, but they that have been baptized into the name of the Lord; for concerning this also the Lord hath said: {Give not that which is holy to the dogs.}



Chapter 10

And after ye are satisfied thus give ye thanks:

We give Thee thanks, Holy Father, for Thy holy name, which Thou hast made to tabernacle in our hearts, and for the knowledge and faith and immortality, which Thou hast made known unto us through Thy Son Jesus;

Thine is the glory for ever and ever.

Thou, Almighty Master, didst create all things for Thy name's sake, and didst give food and drink unto men for enjoyment, that they might render thanks to Thee;

but didst bestow upon us spiritual food and drink and eternal life

through Thy Son.

Before all things we give Thee thanks that Thou art powerful;

Thine is the glory for ever and ever.
Remember, Lord, Thy Church to deliver it from all evil and to perfect it in Thy love; and {gather it together from the four winds}-even the Church which has been sanctified-into Thy kingdom which Thou hast prepared for it; for Thine is the power and the glory for ever and ever.

May grace come and may this world pass away.

Hosanna to the God of David. If any man is holy, let him come; if any man is not, let him repent. Maran Atha. Amen. But permit the prophets to offer thanksgiving as much as they desire.

Chapter 14

And on the Lord's own day gather yourselves together and break bread and give thanks, first confessing your transgressions, that your sacrifice may be pure.

And let no man, having his dispute with his fellow, join your assembly until they have been reconciled, that your sacrifice may not be defiled; for this sacrifice it is that was spoken of by the Lord; {In every place and at every time offer Me a pure sacrifice; for I am a great king, saith the Lord and My name is wonderful among the nations.}
