

St. Ignatius of Loyola—Feast Day July 31



At the age of 30, Iñigo of Loyola lay painfully convalescing in a bed in his sister's house after having suffered severe injuries during the Battle of Pamplona in May of 1521. Iñigo relished his life as a soldier and bravely, or brashly, decided to fight to the last against the invading French forces. Rather than accept defeat and certain humiliation at the hands of the French army, Inigo rose to the top of a fortress and dared the French on. A cannon ball hit him, shattering his right leg and seriously wounding his left. After French doctors cared for him for two weeks, he was sent to his family's castle for the rest of his recuperation.

It was at this time that the life of Ignatius would change forever. Lying in that bed, Ignatius began to read his favorite books on chivalry and soldiering. These books would excite him, but the excitement would only last a short while before he began to be bored and desolate. Later, he was given books on the life of Christ and the lives of the saints. He noticed that these books too would excite him, but unlike the books on chivalry, the excitement did not wane. He would remain in consolation for very long periods of time while reading the holy books. When he realized the difference in

his reaction to the two types of books, Ignatius was on his way to developing his discernment of spirits.

Prayer of St. Ignatius

Take, Lord, receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, my whole will, all that I have and all that I possess. You gave it all to me, Lord; I give it all back to you. Do with it as you will, according to your good pleasure.

Give me your love and your grace; for with this I have all that I need. Amen.

My God, I offer you this holy sacrifice to proclaim, honor and glorify your infinite greatness, and in recognition of the supreme dominion which, as the first principle and last end, you have above all created things. I give you this homage for all those who still do not know you or do not want to recognize you.

I offer this too in thanksgiving for the benefits that I and all the world have received and will receive from your infinite goodness; in satisfaction for my sins and those of the whole world; to implore the graces that are necessary for my eternal salvation and for all mankind. Oh, my God, I offer to you the merits of Jesus Christ; grant me at this Holy Mass a profound adoration of him.

My God, my Creator, I implore you to grant me the grace of final perseverance. I know by faith that I do not deserve it, nor can I deserve it, but your Divine Son deserves it for me with all his virtues and with all the wounds he shows you in his Most Holy Body, on behalf of my wounded love. Amen.

A Brief Explanation of Consolation and Desolation by Venerable Bruno Lanteri, Master of Ignatian Spirituality

Spiritual consolation is known to be proper when, through a certain internal movement, the soul is inflamed with love for its Creator, and can no longer love any creature except for His sake. [As well as] when tears are also shed, provoking that love, whether they flow from sorrow for sins, or from meditation on the Passion of Christ, or for any other reason leading to worship and honor of God properly ordered. Finally, consolation can also be said to be any increase in faith, hope, and charity. Likewise, all joy, which leads the mind to the meditation of heavenly things, to the study of salvation, to rest, and peace with The Master, which true consolation usually encourages.

On the other hand, what should be called spiritual desolation is any darkening of the soul, instigation to base or earthly things; in short, all restlessness and agitation, or temptation drawing one into distrust of salvation, and driving away hope and charity. Whence the soul feels sad, warm, and numb, and almost despaired of the mercy of God his Creator. For just as it is opposed to consolation, so also the thoughts that arise from both are completely opposed to each other. (Desolation can be useful as opportunities for greater merit, self-victory, love for God.)

In the time of desolation, nothing should be deliberated or changed about the purpose of the mind or the state of life, but to persevere in them, which had been previously established, for example, on the preceding day or hour of consolation: for as long as one enjoys that consolation, which we learn, is not of his own making, but is governed by the instinct of the Good Spirit, thus differing from desolation, which is of the evil spirit, by whose instigation nothing is ever done right.

Although a man affected by desolation ought not to change his former plans in the least, it is expedient to provide for and increase those things which tend against the impulse of desolation, such as to insist on prayer and meditation with self-discourse, and to assume something of penitence. (For example, Christ in the garden prayed at length. Ask for joy, and imitate a beggar.)


