Prayer Before Mass

My God, I offer you this holy sacrifice to proclaim, honor and glorify your infinite greatness, and in recognition of the supreme dominion which, as the first principle and last end you have above all created things. I give you this homage for all those who still do not know you or do not want to recognize you.

I offer this too in thanksgiving for the benefits that I and all the world have received and will receive from your infinite goodness; in satisfaction for my sins and those of the whole world; to implore the graces that are necessary for my eternal salvation and for all mankind. Oh, my God, I offer to you the merits of Jesus Christ; grant me at this Holy Mass a profound adoration of him.

My God, my Creator, I implore you to grant me the grace of final perseverance. I know by faith that I do not deserve it, nor can I deserve it, but your Divine Son deserves it for me with all his virtues and with all the wounds he shows you in his Most Holy Body, on behalf of my wounded love. Amen.

St. Kateri Tekakwitha—Feast Day, July 14

She was born in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon (present day Auriesville, NY) in 1656 to one of the local Chiefs of the Mohawk Tribe. Kateri's mother was a Catholic of the Algonquin tribe of Native Americans from the area around Montreal; she was captured in a raid by Mohawk warriors and would eventually marry the chief. Though not baptized till she was 20, Kateri was enamored of the Catholic Faith from her childhood and was close to the Jesuit missionaries who traveled often to her village. The Mohawk name, Tekakwitha, means "she who bumps into things." She received this name due to poor eyesight after contracting smallpox when she was four years old. It was that same smallpox epidemic that took the lives of her father, mother and younger brother.

After the deaths of her family, Kateri was raised by her uncle who was the chief of the Turtle Clan of the Mohawks.

Tekakwitha first met Jesuit missionaries when she was 11 and began to earnestly practice Catholic disciplines. She observed the Lord's Day on Sundays, so she would not work as the other members of the tribe would, which caused her sometimes to be denied food in punishment. Kateri also resisted all attempts to have her marriage arranged by her family. She had made the decision to consecrate her life to Christ in virginity despite the enormous pressure of a society that had no such tradition. She was also known to take frequent walks into the woods for silent prayer to God, where she would make simple crosses and strew them about the grounds.

Tekakwitha's uncle/adoptive father permitted her to be baptized on Easter Sunday in 1676 when she took the name Kateri (Catherine) with the condition that she remain in the tribe, but the pressure and some persecution of her by other members of the tribe convinced her and Jesuit missionaries that she would be better served to join other Catholic Natives at the Christian mission site in Montreal. Kateri secretly evaded detection from her uncle and fled to Montreal in 1677. She would remain in the Christian mission there till her death in 1680 at the age of 24. She spent much time in prayer and penance for her native tribe.

Prayer for the Intercession of St. Kateri

St. Kateri Tekakwitha, you experienced pain, sorrow, and hardship in your life. Yet in all things you found joy in believing in Jesus, present to us in the Eucharist and in his love expressed to us on the cross.

Ask Jesus, our loving Savior, to bring healing to those who are heavily burdened. Through your intercession, may this favor ____ be granted if it is according to the will of God. By your prayer, help us always to remain faithful to Jesus and to his Holy Church.

Loving Creator, I acknowledge your power and presence in the four directions of your vast and beautiful universe. Help me to turn my back on all evil and walk in St. Kateri's footsteps, sharing love and Christian concern with others. Let me reverence your mystical presence in the poor and suffering and share your healing and peace with my family, friends and the sick who we commend to your care.



St. Kateri, maiden so pure, Christian so faithful, lover so kind, I call on you with faith and hope to intercede with our Lord Jesus to bring physical, emotional and spiritual healing to ____, my family and friends. Inspire me to believe as you have believed in the presence and power of Our Lord.

Bright star of love and faith be my guide and guardian always. Follower of purity and prayer, be my advocate before God. Amen.

Pray for us O holy daughter of the Mother of God, that we may find Christ through you, St. Kateri Tekakwitha. Lead us on the road to heaven without ever abandoning us, through your eternal spouse, Jesus Christ. Amen.
