

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Ordinary Time!

"Attend to the pleas of your people with heavenly care, O Lord, we pray, that they may see what must be done and gain strength to do what they have seen." "Almighty and ever-living God, who govern all things, both in heavens and on earth, mercifully hear the pleading of your people and bestow your peace on our times." These two prayers, excerpted from the Mass Collects of the first and second week in Ordinary Time, and which we heard last week and this week, are great themes with which to begin the first days of our new year and indeed every day of our lives. They are profound and speak to us of our need for communion with God in prayer always and everywhere - to be able to know Him, to know what his will is for us, to have the grace and strength to do it, and to live in peace and cultivate his peace. The Collect, or Opening Prayer of each Holy Mass, helps us gather ourselves and opens our heart and mind to aspects of God and his goodness both in himself and toward us. We bring ourselves and our whole being to each Mass and offer ourself to Him in gratitude, repentance, trust and worship.

La Colecta, o Oración de Apertura de cada Santa Misa, nos ayuda a reunirnos y abre nuestro corazón y mente a aspectos de Dios y su bondad tanto en sí mismo como hacia nosotros. Nos acercamos a nosotros mismos y a todo nuestro ser a cada Misa y nos ofrecemos a Él en gratitud, arrepentimiento, confianza y adoración.

Renovación de la Capilla 31 de enero - 9 de febrero

What is the Jubilee Year 2025?

A jubilee year is a time for forgiveness and renewal in our relationship with God. In the Bible, the year was marked by the remittance of debt and property as well as the healing of relationships (between people, nations, and even the relationship between humans and creation) (cf. Leviticus 25:8-55). The first Christian Jubilee was declared in 1300 by Pope Boniface VIII and occurs every 25 years. In 2015 Pope Francis declared an extraordinary Jubilee Year, the Year of Mercy. Jubilees are still marked by forgiveness and renewal. We are exhorted to conversion prayer, repentance and renewed faith. As part of the generosity of the Church and Our Lord, indulgences are given to remove temporal punishment from sins that have been forgiven. Passing through a "holy door" has traditionally been a sign of conversion, passing away from one's old life and into a life of renewed zeal and faith. This year, the only holy doors are in Rome.



The Holy Father Pope Francis desires the Jubilee Year to be a "moment of genuine, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus, the 'door' (cf. Jn 10:7-9)" (*Spes Non Confundit*, 1).

We want to reach those at the margins of society (prisoners, elderly, sick, poor) and those at the margins of our parishes (those who do not know Jesus). We want to foster in them a thirst for Jesus himself and curiosity around him that they may accept the invitation to encounter him at our parishes and pilgrimage sites. For our parishioners, we hope this Jubilee Year will foster determination to be a sign of hope for others and engender greater knowledge of God's mercy, for they are "co-responsible for ensuring that manifold signs of hope bear witness to God's presence in the world (SNC, 17).

"The storms that buffet us will never prevail, for we are firmly anchored in the hope born of grace, which enables us to live in Christ ... This hope, which transcends life's fleeting pleasures and the achievement of our immediate

goals, ... inspires us to keep pressing forward, never losing sight of the grandeur of the heavenly goal to which we have been called. The coming Jubilee will thus be a Holy Year marked by the hope that does not fade, our hope in God."

¿Qué es el Año Jubilar 2025?

Un año de jubileo es un tiempo para el perdón y la renovación en nuestra relación con Dios. En la Biblia, el año estuvo marcado por la remisión de deudas y propiedades, así como por la curación de las relaciones (entre personas, naciones e incluso la relación entre los humanos y la creación) (cf. Levítico 25:8-55). El primer Jubileo cristiano fue declarado en 1300 por el Papa Bonifacio VIII y ocurre cada 25 años. En 2015, el Papa Francisco declaró un Año Jubilar extraordinario, el Año de la Misericordia. Los jubileos todavía están marcados por el perdón y la renovación. Se nos exhorta a la conversión, la oración, el arrepentimiento y la fe renovada. Como parte de la generosidad de la Iglesia y de Nuestro Señor, se dan indulgencias para quitar el castigo temporal de los pecados que han sido perdonados. Pasar



por una "puerta santa" ha sido tradicionalmente un signo de conversión, de pasar de la antigua vida a una vida de celo y fe renovados. Este año, las únicas puertas santas están en Roma.

El Santo Padre Francisco desea que el Año Jubilar sea un "momento de encuentro genuino y personal con el Señor Jesús, la "puerta" (cf. Jn 10, 7-9)" (Spes Non Confundit, 1).

Queremos llegar a los marginados de la sociedad (presos, ancianos, enfermos, pobres) y a los marginados de nuestras parroquias (aquellos que no conocen a Jesús). Queremos fomentar en ellos la sed por el mismo Jesús y la curiosidad por él, para que acepten la invitación a encontrarlo en nuestras parroquias y lugares de peregrinación. Esperamos que este Año Jubilar de nuestros feligreses fomente la determinación de ser signo de esperanza para los demás y genere un mayor conocimiento de la misericordia de Dios, porque son "corresponsables de hacer que múltiples signos de esperanza den testimonio de la presencia de Dios en el mundo". (SNC, 17).

"Las tormentas que nos azotan nunca prevalecerán, porque estamos firmemente anclados en la esperanza nacida de la gracia, que nos permite vivir en Cristo... Esta esperanza, que trasciende los placeres fugaces de la vida y el logro de nuestras metas inmediatas,... nos inspira a Seguid adelante, sin perder nunca de vista la grandeza de la meta celestial a la que hemos sido llamados. El Jubileo venidero será así un Año santo marcado por la esperanza que no se desvanece, nuestra esperanza en Dios." - Spes Non Confundit, 25
