Reflection by Fr. Jeremy Paulin, OMV

My dear Brothers and Sisters in the Holy Cross,

"For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:17)

Today, September 14, is the Feast of the exaltation of the Holy Cross and the Patronal Feast of our Archdiocesan Cathedral. On Good Friday every year we adore the wood of the cross on which hung Christ the savior of the world, Christ who gave his life for us to reconcile us to the Father and to open the way to heaven.

We live because of his death on the cross, and so we try to see everything in light of his suffering, death and resurrection. We accept the crosses in our life and even embrace them as our means to salvation. We lay down our lives as Jesus did.

At Holy Mass we experience the fruit of his saving work, in his Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, sacrificed for us. We receive him in Holy Communion. Everyone is meant to receive him, and to live through him, and with him, and in him.

Next Sunday, September 21, is National Back to Church Sunday. I invite you to invite someone to attend Mass with you next Sunday. Invite them back to the Body of Christ, The Church. Perhaps a family member or friend, somebody who hasn't been to Mass in a while. Pray to Our Lady. Pray to their Guardian Angel and yours, and then confidently invite them. You are a disciple of Christ and his apostle...invite, and may you be delighted at their response!
